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USING OPIOIDS SAFELY







Pain management may be necessary for some dental procedures.

Pain medications options include prescriptions and over -the-counter medications.

Prescription opioids are a family of drugs used to treat pain but when overused or misused can lead to overdose and addiction.

Over-the-counter medication such as acetaminophen (Tylenol) alone or in combination with a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory (NSAID) like Motrin or Advil can be as effective as opioid medication with fewer side-effects.

When pain medication is needed, it is usually needed for only a short time for acute pain or special conditions

List of Possible Alternatives; Ask your dentist:

- Ibuprofen
- Naproxen
- Tylenol
- Warm compresses
- Salt water rinses

HERE ARE SOME REMINDERS...

- Always talk with your dentist ahead of time about how to best manage dental pain and what to expect.
- Studies show non-opioid medication such as acetaminophen (Tylenol) and or ibuprofen (Advil or Motrin) are a safe and effective way to manage pain in many cases.

IF OPIOID MEDICATIONS ARE NEEDED:

- Take only as directed by the dentist (not more)
- Take only for short period (1 3 days).
- Do not share the medication with others.
- Properly dispose of any leftover medication immediately-DO NOT save it at home.
